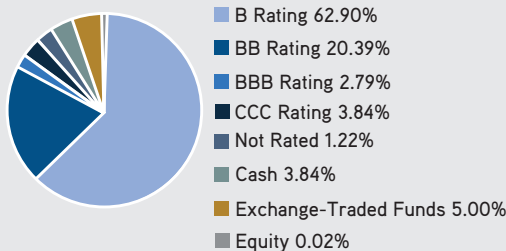

MONTHLY COMMENTARY

April was marked by a sharp reversal in market sentiment as investors navigated the aftermath of March's geopolitical shock and a rapidly evolving macro backdrop. Early in the month, markets remained on edge following the conflict escalation in the Middle East, which disrupted global supply chains and pushed oil prices higher, raising concerns about a sustained inflationary environment and its impact on growth. However, conditions improved meaningfully as the month progressed. A temporary ceasefire and improving visibility around the geopolitical outlook helped stabilize markets, leading to a strong rebound in risk assets. Equities rallied sharply, and credit spreads retraced a portion of their prior widening as investor confidence returned and capital flowed back into riskier market segments.

The leveraged loan market, as measured by the Morningstar LSTA US Leveraged Loan Index, returned 1.29% in April as rising rates spurred investor interest in floating rate instruments while pressuring more duration-sensitive asset classes. For context, high yield bonds, investment grade bonds, and U.S. Treasuries, as measured by the ICE BofA US High Yield Index (H0A0), ICE BofA Corporate Index (COA0), and ICE BofA Current 10-year Treasury Index (GA10), posted returns of 1.70%, 0.56%, and -0.21%, respectively. Returns by rating showed a modest quality bias in favor of lower-rated loans in April as BB and B rated loans rose 1.09% and 1.39%, respectively, while CCC & below rated loans returned 1.70%. The top performing industries in the Index included Building Products and Chemicals, while the performance laggards included Automobile Components and Electric Utilities. Of the 61 industries in the Index, 59 showed a positive return in April.

Primary leveraged loan market activity remained steady in April with \$27.8 billion coming to market following March issuance of \$28.2 billion. From a demand standpoint, gross collateralized loan obligation (CLO) formations slowed in April as gross CLO volume totaled \$30.8 billion (\$18.0 billion net of reset/refinancing). There were no loan issuer defaults in April following one issuer default in the prior month affecting \$312 million in par value. The J.P. Morgan 12-month par-weighted leveraged loan default rate decreased 7basis points (bps) to 1.39%, remaining well below the historical average default rate of approximately 3%. Including distressed exchanges, the default rate ended April at 2.75%, a 116 bps decrease from a year earlier.

The leveraged finance markets experienced heightened volatility through March and early April, as rising rates, geopolitical tensions, and retail outflows drove spread widening. Conditions stabilized later in April, with improving sentiment, moderating geopolitical concerns, and renewed inflows supporting a rebound in performance, tighter spreads, and modestly lower yields. Despite the earlier bout of weakness, primary markets remained open, with issuance rebounding after a brief slowdown and continuing to support refinancing and maturity extension activity. We continue to expect carry to be the dominant return driver through 2026, supported by elevated all-in yields. However, recent volatility and subsequent recovery, most notably in the Software sector, highlight a more dynamic market backdrop, with macro uncertainty, Fed expectations, and geopolitical developments driving swings in risk sentiment. Dispersion across ratings and sectors remains pronounced, reinforcing the importance of disciplined issuer selection, capital structure positioning, and sector differentiation. In our view, the market is continuing to transition into a more discriminating phase of the cycle, where resilient business models, defensible cash flows, and thoughtful underwriting should matter more than broad market beta as conditions remain fluid.
