

MONTHLY COMMENTARY

The leveraged loan market, as measured by the Morningstar LSTA US Leveraged Loan Index, returned 0.45% in August. High coupons and steady collateralized loan obligation (CLO) formations provided tailwinds for the asset class. By comparison, high yield bonds, investment grade bonds, and U.S. Treasuries, as measured by the ICE BofA US High Yield Index (H0A0), ICE BofA Corporate Index (C0A0), and ICE BofA Current 10-year Treasury Index (GA10), returned 1.22%, 1.06%, and 1.55%, respectively.

Returns by rating showed a quality bias in favor of higher-rated loans as BB and B gained 0.50% and 0.52%, while CCC & below declined -0.81%. Liquid loans, as measured by the Morningstar LSTA US Leveraged Loan 100 Index, returned 0.59%. The strongest performing industries included Building Products, Household Durables, and Construction & Engineering, while Household Products, Semiconductors & Semiconductor Equipment, and Aerospace & Defense lagged. Of the 62 industries within the index, 56 posted positive returns.

Primary loan market activity eased to \$76.7 billion in August from \$202.4 billion in July, consistent with the typical summer slowdown. Refinancing and repricing activity has dominated new loan supply, representing 82% of issuance year-to-date (28.4% and 53.2%, respectively). CLO formations remained steady with \$54.6 billion in gross issuance, or \$18.8 billion net of resets and refinancings. Loan defaults totaled \$11 billion across three issuers, increasing the J.P. Morgan 12-month par-weighted loan default rate by 10 basis points (bps) to 1.29%, remaining well below the long-term average of approximately 3%. Including distressed exchanges and liability management exercises, the default rate ended August at 3.37%, down 23 bps from a year earlier.

U.S. growth has been volatile in 2025. GDP contracted 0.5% in the first quarter as firms accelerated purchases ahead of tariff changes but rebounded 3.3% in second quarter as imports slowed. Trade remains a swing factor, though labor and inflation data are increasingly setting the tone of the market. A soft August jobs report reinforced expectations for monetary easing. Tariffs remain in place, with heightened China duties suspended through November 10th leaving growth impulse seemingly more dependent on domestic demand and Federal Reserve policy. Futures markets are pricing a higher probability of a 25 bps cut at the September meeting, with the potential for further reductions into year-end.

Despite the summer slowdown and broader macro crosscurrents, leveraged finance has remained resilient. Issuers continue to extend maturities, reducing near-term refinancing needs. With tariff policy currently stable and growth oscillating around import dynamics, Federal Reserve actions and incoming inflation and labor data should dominate loan market risk pricing into year-end. Investors are likely to remain focused on monetary policy while monitoring trade developments for secondary effects on inventories, margins, and capital spending.
